#### **Western Shasta Resource Conservation District**

What is the RCD? The RCD manages a variety of resource conservation projects, including soil and water conservation, wildlife habitat enhancement and restoration, control of native/invasive plant species, wildfire mitigation and forest health, watershed restoration, conservation planning and more. RCDs provide technical, financial and educational resources and coordinate them to meet the needs of local land users for the conservation of soil, water and related natural resources. The WSRCD Board is made up of community members or landowners who have knowledge and interest in Natural Resources, educating the community and doing projects on the land. Membership is typically local farmers, ranchers, educators and resource professionals.

## **<u>California Water Facts:</u>**

**Precipitation**: California receives an average of 198 million acre-feet of precipitation annually.

**Water Management:** Around 41.2% of the precipitation is controlled and used for various purposes.

**Water Uses:** Approximately 50.4% of controlled water is dedicated to environmental use. About 37.7% is used for agricultural irrigation and 8.8% is used by cities and industries.

**Groundwater:** Groundwater is a significant source of water, especially during drought years, accounting for about 40% of California's total annual supply in normal years and nearly 60% in drought years.

California's interconnected water system serves almost 40 million people and irrigates over 5,680,000 acres of farmland.
