Spring Planting for Shasta County

Spring is an excellent time to get your garden and landscape ready in Shasta Counties' Mediterranean style climate. While the days are warming up, it is still wise to watch for late season frosts which can damage tender plants. Drought tolerant and native plants such as California Poppies, Douglas Iris, Monkeyflower, and lilacs thrive in local soil and require less water once established. For vegetable gardens, early spring is perfect for cool season crops like lettuce, spinach, kale, radishes, peas and broccoli which grow quickly and can handle cooler nights.

Before planting, prepare your soil by loosening it and adding compost to improve fertility and water retention. Use mulch around plants to help retain moisture, suppress weeds and keep roots cool as temperatures rise. Water new plantings deeply but less frequently to encourage strong root growth and consider grouping plants with similar water needs together for efficiency.

Spring Property & Water Tips

Spring is the ideal time to care for your property and manage water wisely. Clear debris from gutters, drains and around your home to prevent water buildup from spring showers. Check hoses, irrigation systems and sprinklers for leaks or clogs to ensure efficient water use. Inspect your property for low spots where water may pool and consider grading or simple landscaping adjustments to prevent standing water. Taking these steps now helps protect your home, conserve water and keep your property in great shape as the season progresses.

Reminder About District Water Meters
