Ordinance 2021-08 was approved by the Board of Directors on 8/30/21 and is effective starting September 1, 2021. The billing implementation will begin September 14, 2021, so please read the ordinance carefully by visiting our website or stopping by the office to see a copy. A summary table is included below:

The CCCSD currently serves an area of 21,670 acres large (33.88 square miles) and manages over 100 miles of pipeline varying in size from 3" up to 45". The original District size totaled 6,800 acres and formation began in the early 1960's.

Our total contract amount from the United States Bureau of Reclamation is 15,300-acre feet annually and during a 'normal' water year. Drought years are subject to allocation restrictions and typically supplies will be augmented with outside water purchases or supplemented with the District water well field. **Thank you for continuing to conserve during this drought year!**

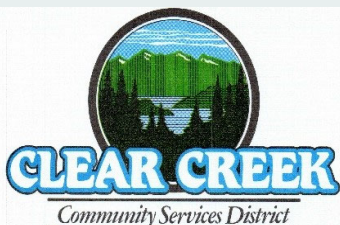

Drought Water Saving Tips

- ◇ ~~W~~ere drinking water in the refrigerator. Do not let the tap run while you are waiting for water to cool.
- ◇ Place a bucket in the shower to catch excess water for watering plants.
- ◇ Minimizing shower time is another simple, yet effective, way to save water. The average person should shower for no longer than 5-10 minutes. In terms of water usage, less is better. However, you should also turn off the water while you're soaping up. This will allow you the time to fully soap up and scrub your body well without wasting water while you do

so.
